Mr Lorenzo Boccabella

Topics: The Saga of Pegios - the Dentist Who Killed his Patient in the Chair

Topic: Biliary Controversies: Acalculous Biliary Pain and Asymptomatic Cholelithiasis

Associate Professor Philip Gan graduated in Medicine at the University of Melbourne 35 years ago and moved to Warrnambool with his family as a general surgeon 24 years ago. He has been the Director of General Surgery at Southwest Healthcare for the last 8 years and is an Associate Professor through the Deakin University Medical School.

During these 24 years in Warrnambool, Phil has taken a particular interest in advanced laparoscopic surgery and introduced many new techniques to the region. He was the first surgeon in regional Australia to report on his initial series of laparoscopic bowel cancer surgery over 2 decades ago and in 2023 was an international invited speaker at SAGES Montreal to present on transvaginal natural orifice colorectal surgery. He has pushed the envelope to do his laparoscopic operations with the fewest and smallest scars possible, using a range of advanced techniques.
